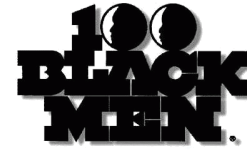

2 April 2011 African American History Challenge Bowl

The 17th Annual African American History Challenge Bowl will be conducted Saturday, 2 April 2011 at the Doyle Administration Building of the Madison Metropolitan School District.

The 100 Black Men of Madison African American History Challenge Bowl is an educational program designed to enhance the study of African American history. The Challenge Bowl is open to all Madison area students with the goal to encourage pride, self-worth and an appreciation of the African American legacy and culture. It is also a challenging and fun way for students to expand their knowledge of African-American History in highly competitive local and national competitions.



The chief authorities for the African American History Challenge bowl are the sixth revised edition of "Before the Mayflower" by Lerone Bennett, Jr. and "The Negro in the Making of America" by Benjamin Quarles.

This 16-year partnership has produced two Madison national 100 Black Men of America African American History Challenge Bowl champions at the junior division.
