

Chancellor Rebecca Blank chose *Just Mercy* by Bryan Stevenson from the short list that a selection committee culled from nearly 200 nominated titles.

2015 Go Big Read Selection

Bryan Stevenson was a young lawyer when he founded the Equal Justice Initiative, a legal practice dedicated to defending those most desperate and in need. One of his first clients was Walter McMillian, a man on death row for a murder he didn't commit. Here Stevenson details the legal journey to McMillian's release as well as those of others he's helped in his now thirty-year career. The book is a call to action, true crime page-turner and critique of the American system of justice - and was chosen as UW-Madison's 2015 Go Big Read.



Mr. Stevenson is scheduled to visit the University of Wisconsin Madison, Monday, 26 October.

Going forward, the plan is after the event, the Madison Police Department and the 100 Black Men of Madison would reconvene as work groups for additional discussion and the development of action steps in which the two organizations could work (**together**) to affect positive change in our city.
