

Focusing on that fact, the AAAT, coordinated by members of the 100 Black Men of Madison, takes a clear look at the challenges confronting our young Black men and endeavors to provide context and insight to the successful negotiations of those abutments.

The goal for each youth who participates in the AAAT program is to improve academic skills, promote positive relationships among peers and adults, encourage a positive attitude toward learning and high achievement, improve GPA each semester and graduate with a 2.5 GPA or higher.

Conducted at LaFollette High School in Madison, WI, the AAAT is actualized in 12 classes taught by successful and committed Black men who share their history and perspective on a variety of topics designed to prepare African American male youth with the mindset and the tools to be successful.
